Yemen leader asks UN to back intervention

Yemen's president has asked the UN Security Council to back military action in support of his government to oust Houthi rebels who control much of the disintegrating country's north and are advancing south

YEMENI GOVERNMENT



Mansur Hadi Elected interim president in 2012 to lead transition to democracy. Resigned in Jan 2015 following Houthi takeover of capital, Sanaa

Escaped house arrest in February to form government in Aden, calling on army to join him

AL QAEDA (AQAP)

Al Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula militant group's most active branch maintains domestic insurgency while keeping sights on Western targets

Saudi forces: Massing on border, Λ could be preparing to intervene

HOUTHIS (ANSARULLAH)

Group established in 1992 to back rights of minority Zaidi Shia people. Began northern revolt in 2004, have since taken control of 12 of country's 21 governorates. Allied with Iran

Ali Abdullah Saleh Ex-president still influential despite being forced to step down in 2012. Accused by West of using alliance with Houthis in attempt to regain power

SOUTHERN AL HIRAK MOVEMENT

Secessionist group wants to reverse 1990 unification and revive South Yemen. Enjoys strong support in Aden but lacks coherent leadership SAUDI ARABIA
