
## **Countdown to a minority government**

If no party wins an overall majority of 326 seats in the House of Commons, a "confidence and supply" arrangement could let a minority government operate without the need for a formal coalition

■ Confidence: Smaller parties prop up minority government or abstain during votes of no-confidence

Conservative-led: Up to 323 seats

Supply: Smaller parties support bills necessary for government to receive money to enact its policies
Labour-led: Up to 354 seats
