Australia creates task force to fight "ice"

The Australian government has established a national task force to tackle the rapidly growing problem of addiction to crystal methamphetamine, also known as "ice", across the country


WHAT IS CRYSTAL METH?

- Illegal drug in same class as cocaine. Part of amphetamine group of drugs potent stimulant speeds up function of brain and central nervous system
- White crystalline "ice" is purest form of methamphetamine about 80 percent pure compared to 10-20 percent purity of powdered form, known as "speed"
- Crystals can be swallowed or smoked, crushed into powder for snorting, or dissolved in liquid for injection or swallowing
- Users experience rush of euphoria and energy lasting up to 24 hours. Side effects include loss of appetite, insomnia, high blood pressure and negative feelings from "comedown"
- Potency makes drug highly addictive. Repeated use can lead to memory loss, aggression, psychotic behaviour and potential heart and brain damage


