## Günter Grass obituary



- Danzig (now Polish city of Gdansk) 1944: Joins Waffen-SS - combat
- arm of Hitler's SS paramilitary force 1945-6: Prisoner of war
- 1948-56: Studies sculpture and painting in Düsseldorf and Berlin
- 1959: Achieves worldwide fame with publication of The Tin Drum -
- first novel in anti-Nazi trilogy 1961: Involves himself in politics. supporting Social Democrat Party
- 1990: Opposes reunification. fearing united Germany would revert to aggressive nation-state
- 1999; Awarded Nobel Prize for Literature
- **2006:** Reputation as moral authority suffers after revealing SS past in personal memoir
- 2012: Poem, What Must Be Said, sparks controversy for strong criticism of Israel
  - 2015: Dies aged 87 in Lübeck
