Islamic State's leaders hard to kill

Despite some 3,200 U.S.-led air strikes against Islamic State since September the leadership remains largely untouched. Just seven of 18 key leaders are believed to have been killed since January 2014

Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi: Leader of so-called Islamic State. Appointed by Bakr and other Iraqi intelligence officers in 2010. Declares Caliphate in June 2014.

Survives air strike in November



Jan, Abu Muhannad al-Suedawi: Former lieutenant-colonel in Iraqi Army and member of IS Military Council. Killed in Anbar province

Feb, Abu Musa al-Shawakh: Syrian national. Islamic State's security minister



Jun, Abu Abdul Rahman al-Bilawi: Former Iraqi army captain, head of Military Council





Sep, Abu Hajar al-Assafi: Member of strategic Shura Council. Killed in U.S.-led airstrike on Mosul



Nov, Abu Muslim al-Turkmani: Islamic State's second in command killed in airstrike near Mosul

Nov, Abu Suja: Real name Abdul Rahman al-Afari. General coordinator killed in air strike
