
## **UK Election declaration times**

There will be a total of 650 constituency results in Britain's General Election on May 7. First results are expected after 23:00 local time, 22:00GMT, with most declarations due overnight



- 00:30-01:30 Declarations: 14 seats. Results include *Durham* and *West Tyrone in* Northern Ireland
- **02:00-02:30 Declarations: 41.** Expected to include four Belfast seats
- 02:30-03:00 Declarations: 32. Including two Westminster seats
- 03:00-04:00 Declarations: 173. Results include Labour-held marginals *Hampstead and Kilburn* (0.08% swing will lose seat), *Bolton West* (0.1%), and *Derby North* (0.1%); Conservative marginals *Thurrock* (0.7%), *Stockton South* (0.7%); and Liberal Democrat marginal *Solihull* (0.3%)
- 04:00-05:00 Declarations: 204. Flood of results includes Labour's Southampton Itchen (held by just 0.2% in 2010), and Wirral South (0.7%); Tory-held Sherwood (0.4%) and Broxtowe (0.7%). Lib Dem marginal Dorset Mid and Poole North (0.6% swing) is also at risk. UKIP faces

a tough battle in Rochester & Strood

- **05:00-06:00 Declarations: 108.** Results from Bradford, Liverpool and six Birmingham constituencies, including Labour's battleground of *Birmingham Edgbaston* (held by 1.5%); Conservative-held marginals *Hendon* (0.2%), and *Sherwood* (0.4%)
- **06:00-07:00 Declarations: 52.** Battles include **Thanet South** three-way marginal where UKIP's **Nigel Farage** (left) is fighting for a seat.

While nearly four million people could vote for UKIP – more voters than in Scotland and Wales combined – UKIP could end up with just one seat, *Clacton*, where *Douglas Carswell* won a huge victory last autumn

- **07:00-08:00 Declarations: 16.** Birmingham Hall Green, Portsmouth and two Milton Keynes seats. No more results expected until 12:00
- 12:00-13:00 Declarations: 7. Final results with Con-Lib Dem marginal seat of *St Ives* (3.7% or 1,719 votes) expected to be called at 1pm
