

Mayweather-Pacquiao to become richest fight

The megafight between Floyd Mayweather and Manny Pacquiao is expected to become the top-grossing prizefight of all time

Mayweather
At least \$180m

Pacquiao
At least \$120m

Revenue split: 60% to Mayweather
40% to Pacquiao. Bonus \$20m split
with winner taking \$10.2m and
loser receiving \$9.8m



Ringside ticket sales
\$72 million

Around **1,000** tickets available to public, priced between **\$1,500** and **\$7,500**, sold out in 60 seconds on April 23. Resale prices from **\$100,000**

Remaining **15,500** tickets split between fighters, casino, sponsors and promoters

Capacity: 16,500 seats



Pay-per-view
\$270 to \$360m

Based on purchases in three to four million homes

55-65% (~\$150-233m) will go to fighters, with rest going to cable companies and satellite providers (**30-40%**) and **HBO/Showtime (7.5%)**

Closed-circuit viewing: Tickets priced at **\$150** at MGM venues worldwide

At least \$13m

International broadcast sales **\$35m**

Sponsorships **\$12m**

Merchandise sales **\$1m**
