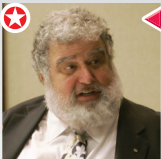


Corruption in FIFA “rampant and systemic”

Twin criminal inquiries have been launched in Switzerland and the U.S. over corruption at world football’s governing body – including the 2018 and 2022 World Cup bids – with seven high-ranking FIFA officials arrested

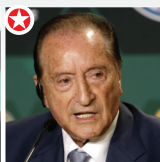


Chuck Blazer: Pleaded guilty under seal in 2013 to bribery, wire fraud and money-laundering, allegedly in exchange for media and marketing rights to international tournaments.
Daryll and Daryan Warner, sons of former CONCACAF President **Jack Warner**, and sports marketing chief **Jose Hawilla**, also found guilty
