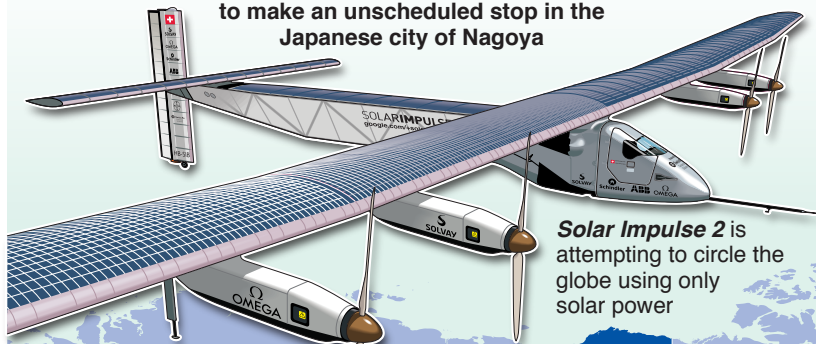


Solar plane forced to postpone Pacific crossing

A record-breaking attempt to cross the Pacific Ocean in a solar-powered plane was aborted after bad weather forced Solar Impulse 2 to make an unscheduled stop in the Japanese city of Nagoya
