▲ The state of Madhya Pradesh in central India was designated a “tiger state” to protect the threatened animal from poachers and settlers

1935: U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt ordered a federal gold vault to be built at Fort Knox, Kentucky

1967: Worshippers were permitted to return to the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem after the Six Day War

1995: Nelson Mandela ordered an investigation into human rights abuses during South Africa’s apartheid era

2005: Emperor Akihito’s visit to Saipan was the first by a Japanese ruler to a foreign battle site
