▲ **The Fatih Sultan Mehmet Bridge was completed in Istanbul, Turkey, providing a second crossing between Europe and Asia over the Bosphorus**

1898: Captain Joshua Slocum arrived in Rhode Island after completing the first solo circumnavigation of the world

1905: Troops killed more than 6,000 people in Odessa to restore order as strikes paralysed much of Russia

2010: A deal was signed to site a U.S. anti-missile shield in Poland to defend Europe from perceived threats from Iran and other nations

2013: President Mohammed Morsi of Egypt was deposed by the military
