Guests checking into Japan's Henn-na Hotel, set in the Dutch-inspired Huis Ten Bosch theme park outside Nagasaki, can expect to be greeted and served almost exclusively by humanoid robots

## HENN-NA HOTEL

(Means "Evolve Hotel" in Japanese). Robots to perform 90 percent of tasks

**Room rate:** Lower than traditional hotel due to robot usage, solar power and energy-saving features

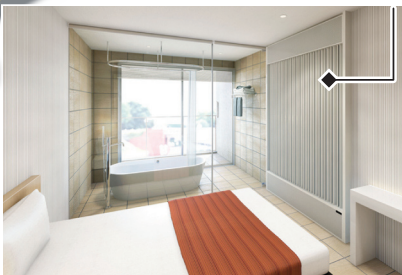


## Receptionists

\*Rooms auctioned online to highest bidder during peak seasons

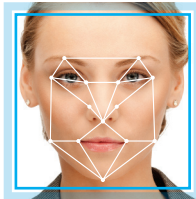
**Radiation panels**
