

Parliaments that must back Greek bailout

Seven of the eurozone's 19 parliaments have opted to hold a vote before approving the plan to give Greece an €86-87 billion, three-year rescue loan – Athens' third bailout in five years

GERMANY



Chancellor **Angela Merkel's** finance chief has demanded that **€50 billion** of prime Greek property assets be lodged in trust fund to serve as collateral for bailout and then be sold off to service debt
Greece owes **€86.7bn***



Bundestag will hold two votes on bailout – first to approve negotiations and amount of aid, second to approve final deal.
Within Merkel's Christian Union CDU/CSU parties right-wing anti-Greek sentiment is on the rise

FINLAND



"Grand Committee" of 25 lawmakers will decide terms of bailout. Finland's eurosceptic foreign minister **Timo Soini** has threatened to bring down government if Helsinki doles out any more money to Athens
Greece owes **€5.9bn**



LATVIA



Prime Minister **Laimdota Straujuma** says it will be difficult to convince parliament
Greece owes **€500m**



SLOVAKIA



Prime Minister **Robert Fico** is reluctant to come to Greece's aid. Favours split with Athens
Greece owes **€2.8bn**



FRANCE



President **Francois Hollande** and German chancellor are deeply divided over how far to go

to keep Greece in eurozone. Germany demands that Greece respect eurozone rules while Hollande supports bridge financing for Greek banks. National Assembly expected to back bailout
Greece owes **€66.3bn**

ESTONIA



Approved initial Greek bailout but has since said "No"
Greece owes **€700m**



AUSTRIA



Parliamentary approval is not in any doubt as opposition Green party is set to vote yes
Greece owes **€9.2bn**
