Oskar Groening: "Bookkeeper of Auschwitz"

Oskar Groening, a former SS guard who worked at the Nazi death camp at Auschwitz, has been convicted by a German court of being an accessory to the murder of at least 300,000 Jewish people in 1944

- 1921: Born in Nienburg, Lower Saxony, Germany
- 1930s: Joins Stahlhelm youth organisation, then Hitler Youth when Nazis come to power in 1933
- 1941: Volunteers for Waffen-SS – Nazi party's military wing
- 1942-44: Serves as guard at Auschwitz. Responsible for collecting belongings of trainloads of arriving Jews and sending any money found to Berlin to fund Nazi war effort
- 1944-45: Wounded during fighting in Ardennes offensive. Taken prisoner after his unit surrenders to British

Charges against Groening relate to period from May-July 1944, when at least 300,000 Hungarian Jews were sent to Auschwitz gas chambers

- 1948: Returns to Germany after war, works as wage accountant in glass-making factory
- 1980s: Speaks out publicly against Holocaust denial. Admits witnessing mass killings but denies any direct role. Charges brought against him dropped due to lack of evidence
 - 2014: Arrested during hunt for Nazi camp guards following successful war crimes trial of *John Demjanjuk*. Charged with 300,000 counts of accessory to murder
 - July 15, 2015: Found guilty by German court in Lueneburg following three-month trial. Sentenced to four years in prison
