Taliban leader Mullah Akhtar Mansoor

The Taliban has elected Mullah Akhtar Mansoor as its new leader, after the group confirmed the death of their founder Mullah Omar





- 1960s: Born in Kandahar province in southern Afghanistan. Details about his exact age and family are largely unknown
- 1996-2001: Serves as aviation minister during Taliban's period of rule over Afghanistan
- 2001: Put in charge of political and military affairs in seven-member, Pakistan-based *Shura*, or Supreme Council Taliban's top decision-making body following U.S.-led invasion of Afghanistan
- 2010: Becomes Taliban's deputy leader after capture of *Abdul Ghani Baradar* in Pakistan

- Apr 2013: Taliban founder *Mullah Omar* (above right) believed to have died, according to Afghan officials. Mansoor probably becomes effective leader of group
- Jun 2013: Taliban agree to peace talks with U.S. over Afghanistan
- Jul 30, 2015: Taliban confirm Mullah Omar died "some time ago". Mansoor named as new leader
- Future: Mansoor's closeness with authorities in Pakistan places him in good position to revive Afghan-Taliban peace talks hosted by Islamabad but put on indefinite hold by news of Mullah Omar's death
