▲ Hungary opened its border to the West, prompting a mass exodus of East German refugees which led eventually to the toppling of the Berlin Wall

1995: NATO deployed the first cruise missiles in Europe in order to break the siege of Sarajevo

2003: Swedish Foreign Minister Anna Lindh was fatally stabbed at a Stockholm department store

2010: The Mexican city of Ciudad Juarez recorded 25 murders in one day

2012: Scientists found that gene switches in DNA play vital roles in how cells, organs, and tissues behave, and influence diseases
