September 19, 1985

▲ **An 8.0-magnitude earthquake struck Mexico City, killing over 10,000 people and injuring 30,000. Much of the city was flattened and 250,000 people were left homeless**

1955: Argentine President Juan Peron resigned and fled into exile

1995: A 35,000-word terrorist manifesto by a man calling himself the “Unabomber” was published by the Washington Post

2005: NASA announced it would send astronauts back to the moon by 2018

2005: North Korea agreed in principle to abandon its nuclear-weapons development in return for economic assistance
