John Kerry makes landmark visit to Cuba

Secretary of State John Kerry will raise the American flag over the U.S. Embassy in Cuba on Friday, ending the Cold War in the Caribbean



- Fulgencio Batista flees into exile
- 1960: Cuba expropriates most U.S. businesses, including oil refineries
- 1961: U.S. breaks off diplomatic relations, Castro declares Cuba socialist state. 24 hours before doomed Bay of Pigs invasion
- 1962: U.S. blockade forces removal of Soviet nuclear missiles from Cuba after standoff brings world to brink of nuclear war
- 1977: President Jimmy Carter partially restores relations with Cuba. but political tensions and 1980
- election of Ronald Reagan end them
- 1988: U.S. arrests five Cuban spies and later jails them for espionage
- 1991: Collapse of Soviet Union devastates Cuban economy

- 2006: Raul Castro, Fidel's brother, takes over presidential duties
- 2009: Cuba arrests USAID worker Alan Gross. accused of subversion
- 2014: President Barack Obama and Castro announce restoration of diplomatic ties and exchange of prisoners - including Gross and remaining three Cuban spies
- May 2015: U.S. removes Cuba from list of state sponsors of terrorism
- Jul 20: Embassies reopened in Havana and Washington
- Aug 14: Kerry (inset) becomes first U.S. Secretary of State to visit Cuba since 1945
