Next steps in new Greek bailout

With a payment of about €3.2 billion due to the European Central Bank on Thursday, Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras needs approval for his country's third bailout from two key euro-area parliaments

Angela Merkel: German Chancellor may face revolt among lawmakers from her party when Bundestag votes in Berlin. Rebellion by Greece's biggest creditor could dent Merkel's reputation



European Stability Mechanism: Governors hold conference call to approve first disbursement of €13 billion to Greece, just in time to pay ECB



Alexis Tsipras: Greek Prime Minister is expected to ask for vote of confidence on Thursday evening or Friday.

43 of Syriza's lawmakers – so called Left Platform – voted against bailout deal. If Tsipras administration fails to secure 121 votes in 300-seat parliament snap election is likely on September 20 or 27
