EU measures to address migration crisis

The European Union is implementing a series of measures to manage the escalating number of people seeking asylum in the bloc



- Naval mission: EU rescue efforts aimed at migrant boats crossing Mediterranean. Operation against people-smugglers began in June
- Emergency assistance: €2.4bn approved for countries struggling with migrant surge almost half going to Italy and Greece. Aid given to UK and France over Calais migrant crisis
- Relocation: EU states pledging to take in about 32,000 asylum-seekers from Italy and Greece short of 40,000 target. Permanent relocation system to be agreed later this year
- Resettlement: Pilot scheme to take in 22,000 Syrian refugees from camps outside Europe to begin soon

- Hotspots: Other EU states to assist Italy and Greece in identifying and fingerprinting migrants at ports of Catania and Piraeus
- Deportation: Economic migrants whose claims for refugee status fail will be returned home more quickly. EU compiling list of "safe" states for whose citizens deportation will be almost automatic
- Development aid: EU to use funds to reduce factors driving migration and urge governments to tackle people-smuggling gangs
- Foreign missions: EU embassies to have immigration officers to monitor migration trends
