Conservative activist and retired neurosurgeon seeking GOP presidential nomination



- **Born:** Sep 18, 1951, in Detroit. Raised in poverty by single mother
- Education: Overcomes violent temper and low grades, eventually winning scholarship to Yale. Goes on to earn medical degree in 1977
- 1978: Begins residency at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore
- 1984: Rises to position of head of pediatric neurosurgery. Becomes famous for groundbreaking work separating conjoined twins
- 2008: Awarded Presidential Medal of Freedom - top U.S. civilian honour
- 2013: Retires from neurosurgery. Becomes active in politics, joining Republican Party in 2014
 - May 2015: Launches bid for Republican presidential nomination
