October 23, 1915

▲ Over 25,000 women marched through New York City to demand the right to vote, the largest such parade yet held. American women finally won the vote in 1920

1955: A referendum in the Saar saw the region vote to rejoin Germany, having been handed to France in 1945

2005: Brazilians soundly rejected a proposal to ban gun sales

2005: Saplings of Wollemi pine, rediscovered in Australia in 1994, were sold to the public for the first time

2011: Cristina Kirchner was re-elected as President of Argentina, making her the first woman in Latin American history to retain the job
