Former U.S. Marine kills his mother and wife, then 16 others from tower at University of Texas at Austin. He is then shot by police

Apr 3, 2009 – New York: Migrant opens fire at immigration centre in Binghamton, killing 13 people and wounding 4. He then kills himself

## 9 killed

12 Jun 17, 2015 – South Carolina: White supremacist gunman kills 9 black churchgoers during Bible study

session at Charleston church.
