Cameron's plans for EU reform

British Prime Minister David Cameron is to meet fellow European Union leaders at a summit in Brussels to present key requirements ahead of an in-out referendum on EU membership



SUPERSTATE Explicit pledge by Brussels to keep Britain out of any moves towards European superstate and exempt it from EU's fundamental principle of *ever-closer union*

THE EURO Explicit statement that euro is not official currency of EU, making clear that Europe is multi-currency union

*BUREAUCRACY "Red card" system to bring power back from Brussels to Britain to stop unwanted directives being handed down and to scrap existing EU laws



REFORM

New structure for EU itself.
London wants 28-nation bloc reorganized
to prevent nine non-eurozone countries being
dominated by 19 member states, with particular
protections guaranteed for City of London
