▲ John F. Kennedy, aged 43, was elected President of the United States. He was the first president born in the 20th Century and the youngest president ever elected

1880: French actress Sarah Bernhardt made her American debut in New York

1895: William Roentgen discovered electro-magnetic rays, which he called X-rays, in an experiment with the flow of electricity through glass

1920: The cartoon character Rupert Bear first appeared in the Daily Express

1975: Lloyd J. Old, a founder of cancer immunology, named a key immune signaling molecule, tumor necrosis factor (TNF)
