▲ Agatha Christie's murder mystery *The Mousetrap* opened in London. Still going strong 63 years later, it holds the record as the world's longest running show

1915: Chilean General Augusto Pinochet was born

1970: Writer Yukio Mishima committed ritual suicide in protest against the westernisation of Japan

1989: Vietnamese boat people rioted in Hong Kong's detention camps at the news of enforced repatriation

2012: The Rolling Stones returned to the stage in the first of five concerts in London and New York to celebrate their 50th anniversary
