▲ U.S. choreographer Busby Berkeley, known for his elaborate dance sequences in films such as *Forty Second Street* and *Gold Diggers of 1933*, was born

1947: The UN General Assembly voted to partition Palestine into Jewish and Arab land

1975: Former F1 world champion Graham Hill died in a plane crash

1995: The CIA reported that the Pentagon had used psychics for 20 years in intelligence gathering

2000: The European Commission introduced a temporary ban on meat and bonemeal in all animal feeds to curb the spread of BSE in Europe
