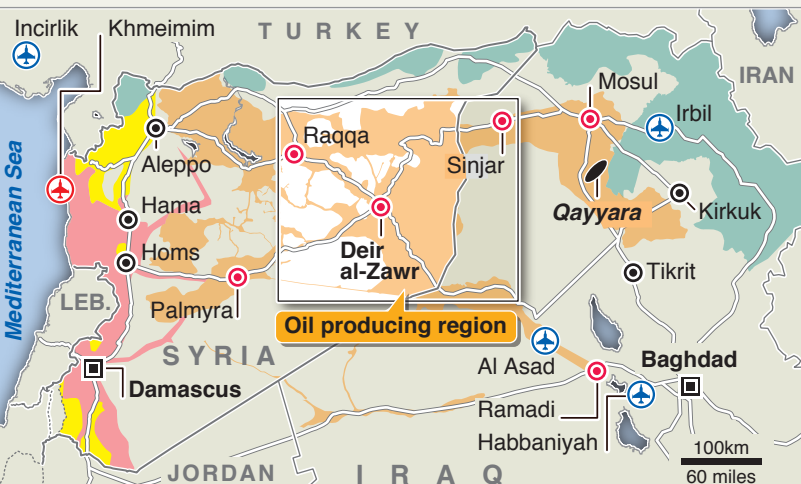


Air strikes target Daesh oil revenue

Daesh makes around \$1.5 million a day from oil fields under its control in Syria, charging traders between \$10 and \$35 a barrel. Refined fuel is sold in its self-proclaimed "caliphate", rebel-held north, and in Turkey

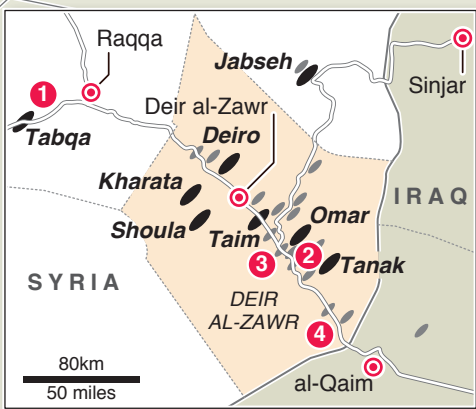
