▲ The Holy Crown of St Stephen, used to crown kings of Hungary since the 12th century, was returned to Budapest after being held by the U.S. since World War II

1066: England's last Anglo-Saxon king, Harold, was crowned

1929: The Kingdom of Serbs, Croats and Slovenes was renamed the Kingdom of Yugoslavia

1941: U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt delivered his famous "Four Freedoms" speech, which outlined freedom of speech and religion, and freedom from want and fear

1993: Russian ballet superstar Rudolf Nureyev died from AIDS
