▲ **Constantinople, capital city of the late Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman empires, was formally renamed Istanbul. Another Turkish city, Angora, became Ankara**

**1797:** U.S. inventor Nathaniel Briggs patented a washing machine

**1979:** A meltdown at the Three Mile Island power plant in Pennsylvania caused the worst commercial nuclear accident in U.S. history

**1995:** Maurizio Gucci, grandson of the luxury leather goods company founder, was shot dead in Milan

**2009:** A Chinese spying network was found to have infiltrated more than 1,000 computers in 103 countries
