



Super Tuesday – voting goes national

Super Tuesday is the day when 14 states and one territory vote to choose a candidate to represent the two parties in the U.S. presidential election. Each state has a fixed number of delegates for each party – they cast a single vote at their national convention for the winning candidate in their state*

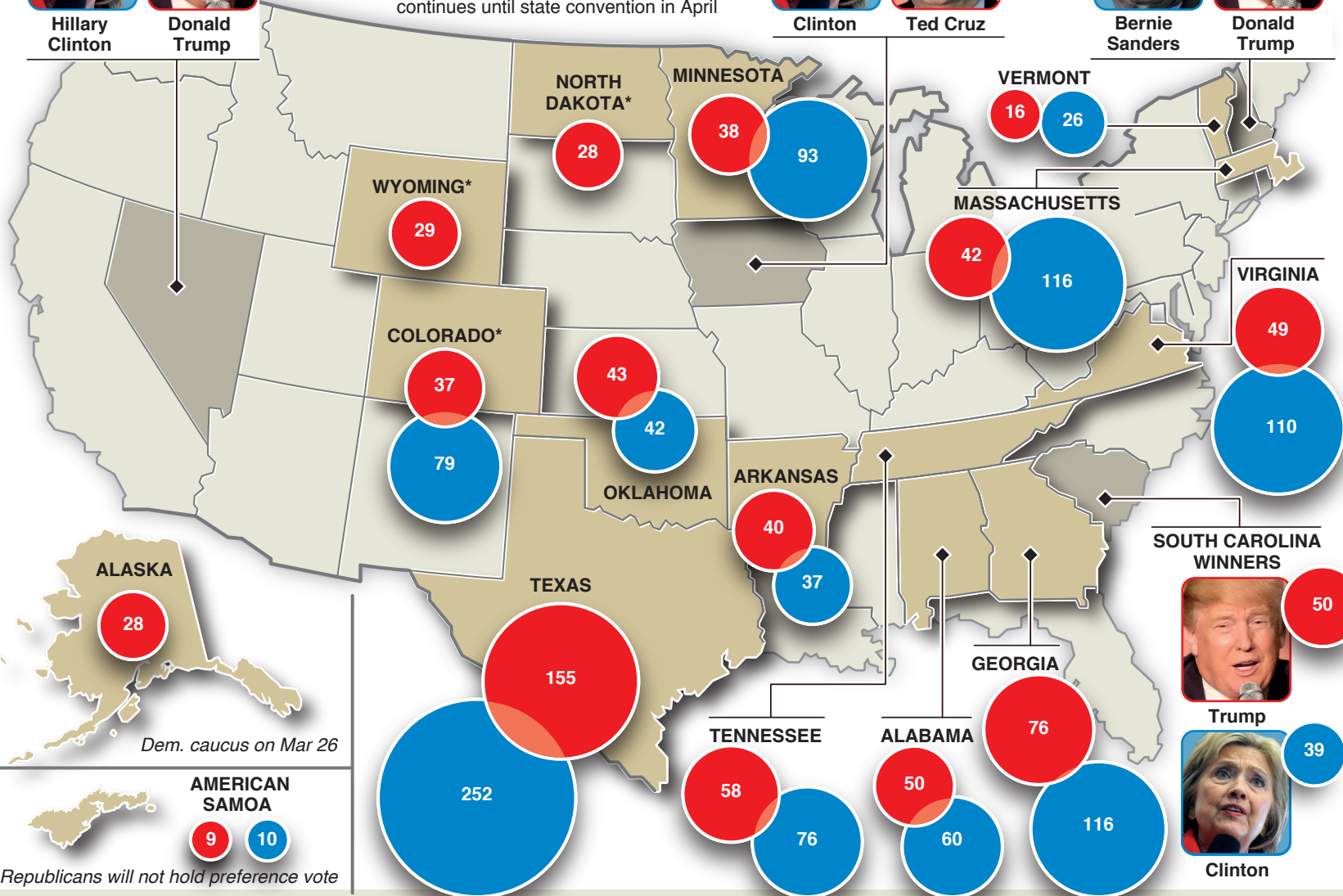
