▲ Sir Isaac Newton recounted how he arrived at the “notion of gravitation” by considering why an apple always falls to the ground in a perpendicular manner

1469: Nanak, the Indian spiritual teacher who founded Sikhism, was born near Lahore

1912: The White Star liner Titanic sank on her maiden voyage after hitting an iceberg. Over 1,500 died

1923: Insulin became generally available for use by diabetics thanks to a breakthrough by drug company Eli Lilly that enabled its mass production

1964: The first Ford Mustang was sold at the New York World Fair
