

Corruption worsens in Arab world

Around one in three people across the Middle East and North Africa has paid a bribe in the past year to public officials or for access to basic services such as medical care, water and electricity

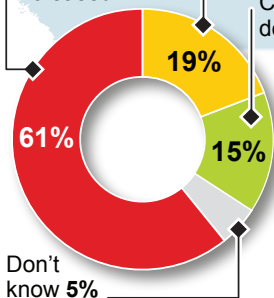

WHO PAYS BRIBES



One in three people (equivalent to around 50 million people) have paid bribe for public services



One in five who paid bribe reported incident



Two in five have suffered retaliation after reporting corruption

Bribery is common in obtaining public services, in court systems and among police in region
