▲ Florence Nightingale founded her nursing school at St Thomas's Hospital in London, which marked the beginning of professional education for nurses

1846: The 49th parallel was established as the border between Canada and the United States

1954: European football's governing body, UEFA, was formed in Basel

1999: European Union agriculture ministers agreed to ban battery farming of chickens from 2012

2002: Arthur Andersen, one of America's five largest accounting firms, was convicted of obstruction of justice in the Enron investigation
