June 27, 1905

▲ **Mutinous Russian sailors took control of the battleship Potemkin in the Black Sea, throwing the commander and several other officers overboard**

1954: The world's first atomic power station opened in the "Science City" of Obninsk, near Moscow

1976: Palestinian militants hijacked an Air France plane to Entebbe, later stormed by Israeli commandos

1986: The World Court in the Hague said the U.S. broke international law by aiding Nicaraguan rebels

2006: Brazilian footballer Ronaldo scored his 15th World Cup goal, a record that stood until 2014
