

April 30, 1916

▲ Daylight saving, advancing the clock by one hour in summer, was first introduced in Germany and Austria to conserve fuel for vital electric power during World War I

1948: The first Land Rover was exhibited at a Dutch motor show

2003: Libya accepted responsibility for the 1998 bombing of Pan Am Flight 103 over Lockerbie, Scotland, which killed 270 people

2009: Chrysler became the first major U.S. automaker to file for bankruptcy

2015: NASA's MESSENGER space probe deliberately crashed into the surface of Mercury after an 11-year mission studying the planet
