▲ The future King James VI of Scotland, later also James I of England, was born to Mary Queen of Scots. He was the first king to rule both England and Scotland





▲ Texan golfer Jordan Spieth won the U.S. Open at the age of 21. It was his second consecutive major victory following the U.S. Masters two months earlier

▲ English explorer Henry Hudson was set adrift with his son and other crew by mutineers in what is now Hudson Bay. The abandoned men were never seen again

1991: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) agreed to offer associate membership to the Soviet Union
