

▲ The United States and Cuba restored full diplomatic relations, reopening their embassies and putting aside more than five decades of Cold War hostility

1816: Baron Paul Julius von Reuter, founder of the news agency that bears his name, was born in Germany as Israel Beer Josaphat

2008: Former Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic was arrested in Serbia after 12 years on the run

2008: Russia and China signed a pact demarcating their 4,300km border

2009: Spain's foreign minister visited Gibraltar, the first government official to do so in 300
