▲ Ohio saloon owner James Ritty invented the first cash register, “Ritty’s Incorruptible Cashier”, to stop his employees from pilfering the profits

1946: The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) was formed

1956: Soviet troops moved in to crush an uprising in Hungary

1961: Bob Dylan, then 20 years old, made his New York City debut at Carnegie Hall

2001: The world premiere of the long-awaited movie version of Harry Potter and the Philosopher’s Stone took place in London
