

# Andy Murray on top of the world

Andy Murray has ended 2016 as the world's top tennis player after victory over Novak Djokovic at the ATP Tour Finals, crowning a remarkable late season surge and extending his career-best winning run to 24 matches

## RISE OF ANDY MURRAY

■ **2005:** Debut in Barcelona, aged 18 – reaches third round at Wimbledon, losing to Nalbandian

■ **2006:** First ATP title in San Jose

■ **2008:** Maiden Grand Slam final at **U.S. Open**. Claims first Masters titles in Cincinnati and Shanghai

■ **2012:** Suffers heartbreak at **Wimbledon**, losing final to Roger Federer – before defeating Federer to win gold at **London Olympics**, and sealing first major at U.S. Open

■ **2013:** Beats Djokovic to become first British man to win Wimbledon since Fred Perry in 1936

■ **2016:** Ends season as world No.1 after first Tour Finals crown – ninth title of stellar year, including second Wimbledon and Olympic titles
