▲ The Oasis of the Seas, first in a new class of cruise ships 40% bigger than any of its rivals, was unveiled. It was the first ship able to carry over 6,000 passengers

1866: The first patent for a rotary crank bicycle, later known as the “bone shaker” was issued in the U.S.

1929: Catalan artist Salvador Dali held his first one-man show in Paris

1961: Bob Dylan recorded his first album “Bob Dylan” for Columbia. It sold 5,000 copies in the first year

1974: The first crash involving a Boeing 747 jumbo jet occurred when a Lufthansa airliner came down after takeoff at Nairobi airport in Kenya
