1821: Panama declared itself independent of Spain and joined the Republic of Colombia

1948: The first Polaroid cameras, otherwise known as instant picture cameras, went on sale in the U.S.

1994: A referendum in Norway rejected membership of the EU

2007: A Faberge egg made in 1902 for the Rothschild banking family was sold at auction in London for a world record £8.9m (\$18.5m)
