▲ **1991:** U.S. airline Pan Am, founded in 1927, was forced to close. Its innovations shaped the global airline industry, including the widespread use of jet aircraft

1918: Woodrow Wilson became the first U.S. President to visit a foreign country when he attended the Versailles Peace Conference in France

1954: The first Burger King restaurant opened in Miami, Florida

1991: American journalist Terry Anderson, the longest-held western hostage in Lebanon, was released after almost seven years

2001: Cambodia opened its first road bridge over the Mekong River
