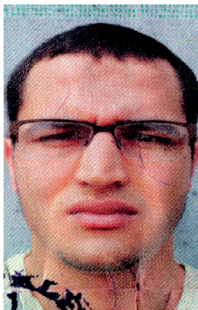


Berlin massacre suspect Anis Amri



Anis Amri, 24: Born in 1992 in Tunisian town of Tataouine. Black hair and brown eyes, height: 1.78 metres. Known to use six aliases

■ **2011:** Leaves Tunisia to escape imprisonment after taking part in armed robbery. Arrives in Italy as an illegal immigrant

■ **2011-15:** Spends four years in Italian jail on charge of burning down reception centre. Amri is ordered to be deported back home after his prison time, but Tunisian authorities fail to complete paperwork

■ **Jul 2015:** Arrives in Germany at Freiburg, near the border with Switzerland and France. Registered in Kleve, near Dutch border. Applies for asylum

■ **Late 2015:** Amri is added to list of hundreds of known Islamic extremists in Germany after being linked to **Abu Walaa** – jihadist preacher who openly supports so-called Islamic State

■ **Feb 2016:** Moves to Berlin, becomes involved in dealing drugs. Identified by German police as potential terror threat

■ **Mar:** Put under surveillance on suspicion of planning robbery to fund purchase of automatic weapons for possible terrorist attack

■ **Jul:** Amri's asylum application is rejected. German authorities prepare to deport him, but Amri does not have valid identity papers

■ **Aug:** Attempt to get replacement passport issued by Tunisia takes until December

■ **Sep: Surveillance called off**

■ **Dec 23: Amri – prime suspect in deadly attack on Christmas market in Berlin – is shot dead by police in Milan, Italy**
