

President Trump's priorities on day one

Upon being sworn in as the 45th President of the United States, Donald Trump will move quickly to implement the immediate priorities of an agenda which promises to “make America great again”

■ **Trade:** Issue notice of intent to withdraw from ***Trans-Pacific Partnership***, signed with 11 other countries in Feb 2016. **Focus to be on negotiating bilateral trade deals that “bring jobs and industry” back to U.S.**



■ **Energy:** Cancel restrictions on U.S. energy production, including shale energy and coal mining, to create “many millions of high-paying jobs”. **President Obama’s 2015 *Clean Power Plan*, intended to cut power sector carbon emissions, could be one of Trump’s first targets**

■ **Ethics reform**
Impose five-year ban on government officials becoming lobbyists, and lifetime ban for lobbying on behalf of foreign governments. **Term limits for members of U.S. Congress could also be imposed**

■ **Regulations**
Formulate rule stating that for every new regulation brought into force, two old regulations must be eliminated. **Trump previously pledged to axe 70 percent of regulations, but keep environmental and safety rules**

■ **Defence:** Instruct Pentagon and chairman of Joint Chiefs of Staff to develop “comprehensive plan to protect America’s vital infrastructure from cyber attacks and all other form of attacks”

■ **Immigration:** Launch investigation into visa abuses that undercut U.S. workers. **Trump remains quiet on whether his campaign promise to build wall along southern border with Mexico is immediate priority**
