February 14, 1852

▲ **Great Ormond Street Hospital opened in London as the Hospital for Sick Children. Its first patient was Eliza Armstrong, 3, who was treated for tuberculosis**

1929: The Valentine's Day Massacre took place in Chicago, as Al Capone's gang gunned down seven rivals

1946: The ENIAC "electronic brain" computer went into operation at the University of Pennsylvania, performing calculations in seconds that normally took hours

1992: EC and EFTA nations created the world's largest free trade zone

2011: The Arab Spring revolution spread to Yemen and Bahrain
