

United attempt to fill Trump's abortion gap

A global effort is underway to support family planning charities affected by President Donald Trump's ban on U.S.-funding of international groups that provide abortions or abortion information

■ **“She Decides”**: Netherlands launches fund to help women access abortion services, after Trump reinstates “global gag rule”

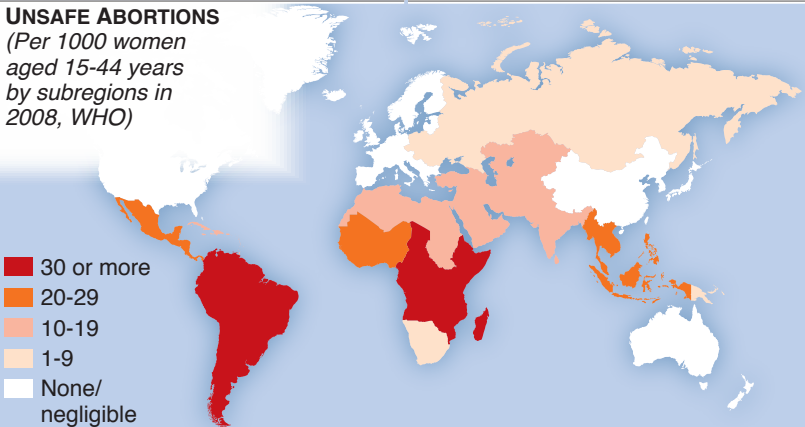
■ Project estimates ban could lead to shortfall of \$600 million over next four years

■ Worldwide, 21.6 million women have unsafe abortions each year, nine out of 10 of which are in developing countries

■ Around 303,000 women die every year in pregnancy and childbirth, according to WHO
