

UK weapons used in Yemen conflict

Since Saudi Arabia entered the Yemeni civil war in 2015, the British government has licensed over £3.3bn (\$4.1bn) in arms sales to the Middle Eastern kingdom, according to the Campaign Against Arms Trade

■ **Aircraft:** *Typhoon* and *Tornado* jets made by BAE Systems play central role in Saudi-led bombing campaign in Yemen.

Over 4,700 civilians have been killed and 8,000 injured in air raids and fighting since March 2015

■ Precision-guided weapons

UK admits use in Yemen of Raytheon's *Paveway IV*, MBDA's *PGM500* bomb and *Brimstone* and *Storm Shadow* missiles, and BAE's *ALARM* anti-radiation missile

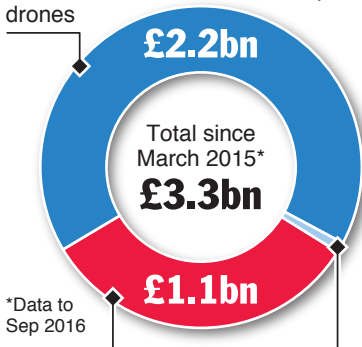
■ **Cluster bombs:** "Limited number" of UK-made *BL755* – supplied to Saudi Arabia in 1980s – dropped in Yemen. Weapon puts civilians at risk by releasing many small bomblets (*below*) over wide area



■ **Other equipment:** Assault rifles, grenade launchers and components for military vehicles and helicopters supplied in recent years – all with potential use in conflict
