▲ Kenyan authorities burned \$172m worth of contraband ivory to combat illegal trade. The haul comprised 105 tons of elephant tusks and 1.35 tons of rhino horns

1945: Adolf Hitler and Eva Braun, his wife of one day, committed suicide in his underground bunker in Berlin

1993: Tennis star Monica Seles was stabbed on court during a match in Hamburg, Germany

2009: Chrysler became the first major U.S. automaker to file for bankruptcy

2015: More than 230 women and children were freed from captivity as Nigerian troops destroyed 13 Boko Haram camps in the Sambisa Forest
