

# Make-or-break week for Britain

**TUESDAY:** First meeting of Prime Minister **Theresa May's** reshuffled cabinet, following disastrous general election result which left her with no overall majority. Parliament reconvenes to elect its Speaker – new MPs are sworn in for rest of week
